Mrs. Rainwater was born in Haskell County and attended school at Anderson Chapel and Union. She attended licensed vocational nursing school at Anson General Hospital, where she worked for 25 years, and was a member of LVN Association Division 54. She was a member of Anson Church of Christ and A.A.R.P. and served on the board of directors for Meals on Wheels. She was a former member of Lioness Club and a “Pink Lady.” She married Aubrey Lee Rainwater in 1931 in Anson; he preceded her in death.

Survivors include four sisters, Billie Brown of Neinda and Vernell Maxwell, Charlene Brown and Estie Goza, all of Anson; three grandchildren and six great-grandchildren.
