

LITTLE ROCK, Ark., April 24.—The United States Grand Jury to-day indicted all the judges and clerks who served at the recent election at Morrilton, Conway County. This is not known, and when the news comes out to-morrow there will be a howl of indignation all over the State. This is the work of Judge John McClure, known to fame as "Poker Jack."

Those indicted are Walter P. Wells, R. A. Baird, Green Roberts, Wood Rainwater, and C. C. Bell. They are charged with stuffing the ballot boxes and falsifying the returns at the last Congressional election in Morrilton, where Langley and Breckinridge were candidates for Congress. Rainwater and Bell were clerks. The others were judges of elections. The charges will be prosecuted by McClure and District Attorney Waters and defended by three of the most prominent attorneys in the State. The indicted men are all prominent merchants and leading citizens. The matter will develop into a political sensation of national interest.
