**ASSERTED HYPNOTIST
ARRESTED IN HANFORD**

HANFORD, April 11. (P)—While a woman slept peacefully in a Hanford store window under a supposed hypnotic spell, I. Shouman, merchant, and a "Dr. Dezita," asserted hypnotist, were arrested today for violating a city ordinance prohibiting mesmerism. As the woman was already slumbering soundly, Shouman and "Dr. Dezita" were released on \$100 bail each and permitted to go back to the store and wake her up, as scheduled, twenty-four hours after she had been "put to sleep."

**TWO HOMES BURN
IN FELLOWS BLAZE**
