- (9) Q. Company? A. "B"; Name of his Captain Capt. Sumner
- (10) Q. Regiment? A. Graham; Name of his Colonel Major Graham
- (11) Q. How long did he see actual service? A. about 1 year
- (12) Q. Was he ever wounded? A. No
- (13) Q. How badly? A. —
- (14) Q. Was he ever taken prisoner? A. He was not
- (15) Q. Under what circumstances was he released? A. paroled
