

Rupert Weddle dies at 83

Rupert Christopher Weddle of Route 1, Liberty died Friday morning at his home. He was 83.

Casey County Deputy Coroner Algie Atwood said the cause of death was cardiac arrest.


Weddle was a prominent Casey County merchant and farm owner. He was the father of County Attorney James G. Weddle.

Rupert Weddle owned the R.C. Weddle Grocery Store on U.S. 127, south of Liberty. He also farmed hundreds of acres of Casey County land.

Weddle's store was widely known for its bologna sandwich and as a showcase for GOP posters, including ones that promoted Presidents Eisenhower and Reagan. While Weddle never held public office, he was influential in many campaigns.

James Weddle said the popularity of his father's bologna sandwich was a mystery. He said his father served only bologna and cheese sandwiches at the store and always sliced the bologna thick.

James Weddle also said his father, who probably only had a grade school education, was always proud that 10 of his 14 grandchildren had college degrees. Rupert Weddle was also proud that one of his nephews was a doctor and another will soon graduate from medical school.



RUPERT WEDDLE

Born April 30, 1901 in Pulaski County, Weddle was a son of the late William Marion and Dora Compton Weddle. He moved to Casey County in 1919.

He was married on Feb. 25, 1928 to the former Laura Price, who survives. A daughter, Norma Jean Murphy, and two brothers, Kenneth and S.W. Weddle, Sr., preceded him in death.

Besides his wife and James G. Weddle, other survivors include another son, R.C. Weddle of Liberty; one daughter, Delores Sasser of Louisville; two brothers, Leonard Weddle of Liberty and Lloyd Weddle of Hopkinsville; 14 grandchildren; and nine great-grandchildren.

Funeral services were Monday, Feb. 18, at 1 p.m. by Donnie Coffey, Danny Baily, and Roosevelt Brown. Musical selections were provided by Janice Popplewell.

Burial was in Casey County Memorial Gardens.

Guest editorial

Editor's note: The following guest editorial was submitted by Raymond Overstreet. It contains his opinions and observations on Rupert Weddle, a longtime merchant and political figure here who died last week.

Other than his famous bologna sandwich, which he loved to kid candidates about, his fondness for children was unheralded. I can recall one time being at Mr. Rupert's store and seeing two

small youngsters come in to buy some candy. They had saved some pennies but they didn't have enough pennies to buy the candy they wanted. Mr. Rupert sacked their candy up, gave it to them and told them to put their pennies back in their pockets. I saw two happy youngsters leave that store with their sack of candy and in their eyes no man stood taller than Mr. Rupert. Weddle.
