REVOLUTIONARY WARE PENSIONERS IN BIBB CO. ALA.

WILLIAM TABOR NC W-6246

&

SUSANNAH TABOR

Bibb County, Alabama..16 October 1832. WILLIAM TABOR, aged 71, makes application for pension under Act of June 7, 1832.

He states that he enlisted in 1780 and served under ALEXANDER IRVINE, COL. CHARLES MCDOWELL (afterwards General). Enlisted while residing in Burke County, North Carolina. In the latter part of 1780, the applicant's father removed from Burke County to Rutherford County, North Carolina. About January or February 1781, the applicant volunteered and was chosen Ensign, serving two or three months under LIEUTENANT URSERY and CAPTAIN JOHN ANDERSON. LT. URSERY resigned and the applicant succeeded to place 6 or 8 months, under orders given by COLONEL ROBIN PORTER. He knows of no person who can testify for him except JOHN TUBBS and SUSANNAH TABOR.

SUSANNAH TABOR testifies that she married July 5, 1781 WILLIAM TABOR in Rutherford County, North Carolina.

JOHN TUBBS, a Clergyman in Perry County, Alabama states that in 1780-1-2 and later he

resided in Rutherford County, North Carolina and recollects that WILLIAM TABOR was in the Revolution. ROBERT PARKER, testified.

WILLIAM TABOR was born in Orange County, North Carolina, January 4, 1761 according to the Family Bible. He resided in Rutherford County, North Carolina, then in Greenville South Carolina, then moved to Pendleton District, South Carolina, then to Franklin County, Tennessee, to Shelby County, Alabama and then to Bibb County, Alabama.

His discharge was given by CAPTAIN NEVILLE. References: JOHN HUNT, RANSOM MCELROY, SAMUEL W. MARDEIS (MARDIA), WILLIAM SAWYERS, ROBERT PARKER.

SUSANNAH TABOR, 85, widow of WILLIAM TABOR applies for widow's pension under Act of July 9, 1836. On March 3, 1843, her husband received his pension money up to March 4, 1844. She testifies that they were married in Rutherford County, North Carolina

July 5, 1781 by JOSEPH KEMP, minister. WILLIAM TABOR died in Winston County, Miss.
June 4, 1844.

ZACHEUS CORLEY SC S-16,736

Bibb County, Alabama, December 3, 1832. ZACHEUS CORLEY, aged about 70, a resident of Bibb County, Alabama, applies for a pension for his Revolutionary services, which pension is authorized by an June 7, 1832, Agency: Tuscaloosa.

ZACHEUS CORLEY stated that he enlisted under CAPTAIN JOHN MITCHELL May 1780; served under COL. HAMMOND, MAJOR PURVIS; joined GEN. GREENE at Cambridge, South Carolina served two weeks and then joined light horse, under CAPTAIN SOLOMON POPE. Was taken prisoner and had small pox. STARLING TURNER was Lieut., promoted to Captain when POPE was ill and a prisoner. CORLEY remained with CAPTAIN TURNER until killed. About the last of May 1781, he enlisted and served about 12 months and 2 weeks. June 1, 1781 he enlisted and served under CAPTAIN WILLIAM BUTLER. Resided in Edgefield District, South Carolina at the time of enlistment.
