

Death Claims Mother of Mrs. John Knott

Mrs. Violet R. Bowen, for fifty years a resident of Dallas, died at 9:30 o'clock Sunday morning at the home of her daughter, Mrs. John Knott, 122 North Winnetka avenue. Death came after an illness of several months.

On Aug. 23, 1854, Mrs. Bowen was born in Roswell, Ga. At the age of 20 she came to Dallas to make her home with her brother, D. T. Rainwater. At the time of her marriage in 1878 she built the home at 1306 Wood street in which she lived until last summer. This house still stands as a landmark of the old residence part of Wood street.

Mrs. Bowen is survived by her daughter, Mrs. John F. Knott; her sister, Mrs. Mary E. Webb, and five grandchildren, Jack, Helena, Karl and Marjory Knott and Miss Violet Bowen of Los Angeles.

Funeral services will be conducted by Dr. George W. Truett, pastor of the First Baptist Church, at the home of Mrs. Knott o'clock Tuesday afternoon.
