

John W. Bowen III, Trial Is Postponed

AUSTIN, Texas June 1 (AP).—J. D. Moore, District Judge, Monday postponed the trial of John W. Bowen, 69-year-old Dallas investment man, until June 29. Bowen was indicted on nine charges of forgery of witness fee scrips.

Bowen's trial had been set for today. Maury Hughes, his attorney, asked for a continuance on the grounds that Bowen was so ill with heart disease that the excitement of the trial would jeopardize his life. An affidavit and a statement from two Dallas physicians were attached to the motion for continuance. One of the physicians said Bowen had been in bed since May 15.

The affidavit was signed by Dr. Callender L. Johnson of Dallas and Dr. John F. Ford of Dallas signed a supporting statement.
