David TRIMBLE was born about 1720 in Scotland.(21) He died in 1799 in Bourbon County, Kentucky. (21) David was one of five brothers coming to America from Scotland by way of Armagh County, Ireland in the early 1730's. Settled first in Pennsylvania. We can find no court records of his marriage, but there was an old letter, written by his eldest daughter, Elizabeth, in which she said her Mother was a Houston. Also General Sam Houston studied Law under James Trimble, a great-nephew of David., from Nashville, Tennessee. Gen. Houston described James as a "Kinsman". The Houstons and Trimble's lived on neighboring plantations in Virginia, the birthplace of General Sam Houston.

I was told by his niece that he always wore a big overcoat and a big hat and that is the way I remember him when he attended the funeral of his nephew Homer Ouimby (my uncle) I was almost 10 years old and had never heard of him before (I think he had just gotten out of prison) and it was the only time I ever saw him. One of his half brothers, George, refused to attend his funeral until other family members convinced him that he should. George believed that Roy had hastened their fathers death. One of his nephews called him the meanest SOB that ever lived. Another nephew called him a pretty good old boy. He says Roy killed 2 men at different times that he caught with his wife but he doubts the Indians. One thing everyone remembers and agrees upon is that he was never seen without his 2 little dogs.

For many years before his death, he and his wife lived apart but never divorced. Have never heard that he left any descendents." (Sent to Patty Onek from Fern, Dalene and Kenneth Kruse, in December 1998. It was given to them by someone who had a Quimby book about the family, we know of several errors in the information, but this story seems reasonable).
