# "A" Declaration for Original Invalid Pension. "A"

STATE OF Kentucky  
 COUNTY OF Pulaski } S. S.

On this 19<sup>th</sup> day of May A. D. one thousand eight hundred and seventy

personally appeared before me A. G. Trumble Clerk; the same being a Court  
 of Record of the County and State aforesaid John R. Compton  
 a resident of Waterloo County of Pulaski State of Ky

who being by me duly sworn according to law, on his solemn oath, deposes as follows, to wit:

"I am the identical John R. Compton who was enrolled on the 5<sup>th</sup>  
 day of November 1861 in Company D of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Reg't of Ky  
 Vol's., commanded by Captain John C. Bolser and I was honorably discharged at  
Louisville on the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Jan 1863 and my age is  
 now 54 years. While in the service aforesaid, and in the line of my duty I received the following disability, to wit:

In April 1862 while on a forced march from Nashville Tenn to Corinth Miss. I Nervous Disease and General Debility - caused by over exertion, fatigue and exposure during the said march and campaigning. I was treated by Reg. Surg: and was first sent to Hosp. No 15 at Louisville Ky. in April 1862.

I claim Pension for Nervous Disease and Gen. Debility.

I have never been employed in the Military or Naval Service of the United States otherwise than set forth above  
Since leaving the Service, I have resided at Pulaski Co. Ky.  
and my occupation has been Farming before my entry into the Service aforesaid I was of good,  
ound physical health, being at enrollment a Farmer and I  
am now Partially disabled from obtaining my subsistence by manual labor by reason  
of my disabilities above stated, received in the service of the United States, and I make this Declaration for the purpose  
of being placed on the Invalid Pension Roll of the United States. I hereby appoint and empower, with full power of  
substitution, NATHAN W. FITZGERALD, OF WASHINGTON CITY, D. C. my true and lawful Attorney to prosecute  
my claim. My Post Office address is Malertoo County of  
Pulaski State of Ky."

I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt from your Office of application for Pension No. 292,756, and to return it herewith, with such information as is furnished by the files of this Office.

It appears from the Rolls on file in this Office that John R. Compton was enrolled on the 5<sup>th</sup> day of Nov, 1861, at Camp Wolford, in Co. "K" 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Kentucky Inftry Volunteers, to serve 3 years or during the war, and mustered into service as a 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt. on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of Jan'y, 1862, at Camp Boyle, Ky in Co. "K", 3<sup>rd</sup> Regiment of Kentucky Inftry Volunteers, to serve 3 years, or during the war. On the Muster Rolls of Co. "K" of that Regiment, for the months of Feb'y 28<sup>th</sup>, 1862, he is reported Present. Subsequent rolls to Aug 31/62 are not on file. Sept. and Oct. 1862 Present. Mustered out with Co. as a 1<sup>st</sup> Sgt. Jan'y 10, 1865. Reg'l Returns for Feb'y and to Aug 1862 not on file. Co. and Reg'l Books not on file.
